

Hemlock Woolly Adelgid "Look-Alikes"

Remember that hemlock woolly adelgid (pictured above):

- Has "wool" that is attached to the twig not the needle.
- Is immobile when covered in wax
- Is waxy, not silky or stretchy
- Is wispy like a cotton ball, not fabric-like
- Has separate balls of "wool"
- Doesn't look painted on (like pine sap)
