Emerald ash borer (EAB) was first detected in Vermont in 2018, and is now present in 35 states and 5 Canadian provinces. Vermont will lose over 99% of our native green, white, and black ash trees.










Do you have an ash tree?

- Diamond shaped bark
- Compound leaves
- Paddle shaped seeds

Water sprouts

Thinning canopy

S- shaped tunnels
